The Facility



Centrally located in suburban Philadelphia and within easy access of the New York City, New Jersey and Washington, DC population centers.

The NSEC will be the first World Class indoor cycling facility and multi-use special events center in the Eastern United States. As a site for local, intercollegiate, national and international cycling competition, this leading edge facility will include a 200 meter board track that replicates the World Training Center velodrome in Aigle, Switzerland. The facility will also include a cycling performance center, 2500 permanent seats, sky boxes for corporate sponsors and donors, a full service bar and restaurant, leasable retail and conference space, flexible infield for hosting concerts and a variety of non-cycling sporting and special events.
